Mirko Mayer Gallery was founded in Cologne in 1998 by Mirko Mayer, whose experience stems from organising exhibitions in artist spaces, public and private spaces and other galleries during his studies in art history. Growing up in a family that collected photography and ran a photography gallery in the eighties and nineties gave Mayer an early education in the mechanics of owning a gallery himself.

Mirko Mayer Gallery's main focus lies with artists who work in two and three-dimensional realms simultaneously. As a result,

exhibitions at the gallery are often installation and space specific. Most of its artists challenge their usual work spectrum and combine different techniques and genres of art.

This year, the gallery premieres work by Ralph Baiker. It also presents work by Mia Boysen that she hopes to be the starting point of a dialogue about the production and presentation of value in our consumer culture. Focusing on the world of luxury, each photograph addresses individual aspects of this multi-dimensional
